



QCWA CENTENARY BURSARY (YOUNG LEADERS) APPRENTICESHIP

QCWA is celebrating its Centenary in 2022 and is offering a Centenary Bursary of \$2,500.00 to an apprentice. The apprentices' home/work address will be in a rural or remote area of Queensland and personal circumstances necessitate financial support. Applications are invited from female apprentices who have undertaken an apprenticeship and are required to attend formal, off the job training at a Registered Training Organisation (RTO).

Funding for this Bursary has come from monies held in trust for QCWA Young Leaders. Young Leaders was a QCWA Membership class of young women and girls up to the age of 25 years.

The Bursary is to be administered by the QCWA State Executive Board. Prospective applicants may also be interviewed.

Applicants may be part-time, or full-time apprentices.

Applicants to submit:

1. Proof of acceptance into RTO
2. Proof of achievement
3. Demonstrate the need for financial support
4. Three current character references (incl. current employer)
5. Details of proposed training course
6. Short (500 word) resume of applicant's achievements and future aspirations.

Apprentices who are funded by their employers to attend RTO training will be ineligible to apply.

As part of this bursary, recipients may be asked during the year to make their time and skills available on a voluntary basis to assist the Association with projects and events.

The QCWA will arrange a presentation function for this bursary and recipients will be invited to attend. Family and friends will also be welcome to attend this event.
